Who's on this year's panel?


33% of the respondents to this survey are brand new principals - just starting your first year.


And 67% are practically seasoned veterans, with at least a year on the job.

Most of our new principals are **ages 30-49**, but some of you are proving you're never to old (or too young) to try something new!

- · 2% are under 30 years old
- 35% are in your 30-39's
- 41% are in your 40-49's
- 22% of you are over 50

Almost 60% of your schools now include **Pre-K**, and nearly 70% of you are leading **Title I** schools.





Are you up for the challenge?

Professionally, you anticipate your greatest challenges this year to be:

- Being an effective instructional leader (82%)
- Managing your time/setting priorities (48%)
- Working productively with staff (47%)
- Achieveing a healthy work/life balance (43%)
- Growing my professional skills (28%)

The success of your students, however, will prove to be your greatest school-wide challenge:

- Student academic achievement (54%)
- Closing the student achievement gap (48%)
- Teacher quality issues (27%)
- Budgetary concerns (27%)
- Special education isues (24%)

And, great news for everyone, most of you (58%) plan on staying in the principalship for at least another 5-10 years!


How did you get here?

Nearly 2/3 of new prinicpals assumed the role after working as an Assistant Principal.

22% came directly from a teaching position.

What about your school?

- Most of you (52%) have between 21 40 teachers on your staff
- For the majority of you, the percent of English-language learners in your school is less than 10%. For almost 8% of you, however, more than half of your students come to school speaking a different language.
